Continued employment of a Speech and Language Therapist – many children enter school with very low communication skills. The Speech and Language Therapist works 1:1 or in small groups with children to increase their language skills. She also trains and offers support to staff and parents. In addition to this the therapist carries out Wellcomm screening, dyslexia screening and provides detailed reports for school, parents and external agencies as required	
Continued employment of counselling service from Caritas – the school employs the services of Caritas in the form of a Family Support Worker who works with children facing emotional and/or behavioural difficulties both in school and at home. Children receive high quality support in their one to one meetings with the FSW. He also visits the home and offers support to parents and other members of the family

Leasing of a school minibus to ensure learning in a real context

Subsidising of school trips, residentials and events to ensure access for all children

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

Teacher estimates showed that 33% of PP children attained the GLD. None of the F2 children attended school after 20th March 2020

In Year 1 it was estimated that 64% of children would have attained the Phonics Screen.

In Year 2 it was estimated that 82% of PP children would have attained the reading and writing level with 100% achieving the Maths level and 82% achieving reading, writing and maths combined.

In Year 6 teacher estimates showed that 67% of PP children would have attained the reading level with 56% attaining writing and maths and 44% attaining reading, writing and maths combined.
