<p><u>Curriculum</u></p> <p><i>Reduced ratio of children to staff in KS1 and KS2 to increase impact and improve attainment and progress.</i></p> <p><i>Targeted support in maths – First class@number, Mission Maths and catch up maths programmes</i></p> <p><i>Purchase of Mathletics and Maths of the Day to accelerate progress in Maths</i></p> <p><i>Purchase of resources to implement “The Power of Reading”</i></p> <p><i>Library refurbishment – to raise the profile of reading and to increase the children’s love of reading</i></p> <p><u>Inclusion</u></p> <p><i>Employment of a Speech and Language Therapist – many children enter school with very low communication skills. The Speech and Language Therapist works 1:1 or in small groups with children to increase their language skills. She also trains and offers support to staff and parents. In addition to this the therapist carries out Wellcomm screening, dyslexia screening and provides detailed reports for school, parents and external agencies as required</i></p> <p><i>Employment of counselling service from Caritas – the school employs the services of Caritas in the form of a Family Support Worker who works with children facing emotional and/or behavioural difficulties both in school and at home. Children receive high quality support in their one to one meetings with the FSW. He also visits the home and offers support to parents and other members of the family</i></p> <p><i>Employment of Beanstalk Reader – the school employs a Beanstalk reader who visits school twice a week to work with children who are reluctant</i></p>	<p>£53 000</p> <p>£16 000</p>

<p>readers</p> <p><u>Additional support</u></p> <p><i>Additional staff in order that class sizes are small and children can be supported in small groups –focused intervention groups and pre-teaching groups are planned for every afternoon to support children in reaching their targets.</i></p> <p><i>Leasing of a school minibus to ensure learning in a real context</i></p> <p><i>Subsidising of school trips and events to ensure access for all children</i></p> <p><i>Extra curricular clubs – we offer a range of clubs such as art, music, Tales at Teatime, sports and movie night. 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Measuring the impact of PPG spending
<p>63% of Pupil Premium children reached the standard for reading in Year 6, 75% for writing and 50% for Maths and GPaS</p> <p>In Year 2 - 50% of Pupil Premium children achieved the expected standard in reading. 33% for writing and Maths.</p> <p>17% of F2 gained GLD</p> <p>71% of Pupil Premium children achieved Year 1 phonics. 83% of Year 2 Pupil Premium children reached the phonics threshold.</p>
